20 mins	<p>7) What is work? Leader to ask participants what is work?</p> <p>Leader to explain that the definition of work means to put effort into something to achieve an aim.</p> <p>Paid work is a job or occupation for which you get paid.</p> <p>Unpaid work is work you do and do not get paid for. This may be housework or chores, homework, study or looking after children as a parent.</p> <p>Unpaid work may also include <i>work experience</i> or <i>volunteer work</i>.</p> <p>Leader should tell participants to turn to their workbooks. (p. 4). Leader should ask participants to read each example or look at the picture and write paid or not paid next to it.</p> <p>Leader should then review each example and provide feedback to the group.</p>	<p>7) The leader should get ideas from the group.</p> <p>Explain that other words for paid work are: job, occupation and employment.</p> <p>Reinforce that work includes both paid work (for money) and unpaid work (for no money).</p> <p><i>Work experience</i> is work you may do to find out if you like it or to learn about the job for the future.</p> <p><i>Volunteer work</i> is work you do to help an organisation or person. It is often work for charity.</p> <p>Participants might choose to draw a \$ symbol (paid) or a \$ symbol with a cross through it (not paid).</p> <p>Leader may also choose to give further examples to reinforce the participants understanding of paid and unpaid work.</p>	<p>7) In a semi-circle, leader at the front</p>	<p>7) Workbook p. 4 Pens.</p>	
30 mins	<p>8) Types of jobs Leader to explain that there are different types of jobs. The types of jobs people want to do depend on their interests and what they enjoy doing.</p> <p>Leader should write the heading of each type of job on butcher's paper and explain each category (below).
